The Duncan Foundation aims to provide new and essential clinical services to improve the lives of New Zealanders with neurological conditions that impact physical function. We provide:

- services for a person and their whanau to access clinical resources and allied health professionals who understand the management of progressive neurological conditions regardless of regional, cultural, and socio-economic barriers.
- the opportunity for health professionals working remotely or in isolation to access clinical and collegial support when
 working with people living with progressive neurological conditions that impact physical function.

Entity Structure

Operations: 3 part-time contracted staff (CEO, Patient & Admin Coordinator, Funding (vacant)). Volunteer(s) support our team.

Clinician Support Team: 1 contract Clinical director and 4 Clinical Lead roles (contracted through Rope Neuro Rehabilitation Ltd)

Programme Delivery: national provider contracts for clinical services to patients and education to health professionals/community

Main Sources of Entity's Cash and Resources

We are grateful to our primary funding partner The Sir Thomas and Lady Duncan Trust for their ongoing support and value our other key funders who supported us through philanthropic grant funding and donations.

Main Methods Used by Entity to Raise Funds

We are primarily funded through grants and donations received from individuals, trust and community funders.

Additional Information

The Duncan Foundation identifies gaps in allied health services available within the public health system, facilitates access to trained health professionals and provides continuing education to clinicians. We currently support people living with focal dystonia, the late effects of polio, recently diagnosed Parkinson's, Friedreich's ataxia, spinocerebellar ataxia, and other inherited ataxias.

Statement of Service Performance

Duncan Foundation For the year ended 31 March 2024

Description of Entity's Outcomes

The Duncan Foundation is committed to enhancing the physical and mental well-being of New Zealanders living with neurological conditions. Our support spans those with late effects of Polio (LEoP), idiopathic focal dystonia, recently diagnosed Parkinson's (RDP), Friedreich's ataxia (FA), spinocerebellar ataxia (SCA), and other inherited ataxias. As we identify new needs and secure funding, we will broaden our scope to support more conditions.

Individuals with progressive neurological conditions often endure multiple disabilities, including chronic and acute impairments in muscle function, fatigue, and pain, leading to a lower quality of life compared to the general population. Unless they experience an acute event, such as a fall, they are not typically offered a defined treatment pathway. However, clinical interventions can potentially slow decline, sustain quality of life, and reduce the risk of acute events. We are committed to removing regional, cultural, and socio-economic barriers to make our services accessible to all.

Key drivers of our work include providing timely access to services without financial barriers and improving knowledge of condition-specific management in the New Zealand allied health workforce. The Duncan Foundation's network of affiliated clinicians delivers comprehensive assessments, treatment, and referrals for individuals living with neurological conditions. We develop self-management tools to improve quality of life and symptom management and support our clinicians through resource sharing, peer reviews, journal reviews, and continuous professional development.

Our broader goals include advancing knowledge within the health and community sectors. We achieve this by delivering educational presentations, participating in research, and collaborating with patient groups and other providers to understand needs and services and develop relevant treatment protocols. Key activities during the period ended 31 March 2024 include:

Successful Projects

With support of the Bollard Trust, we completed the West Auckland Parkinson's project working with individuals with recently diagnosed Parkinson's providing assessments and interventions to achieve positive outcomes for the individuals involved. However, the broader aim of the project was to identify the differences in available services from diagnosis to availability of support services.

- We also worked closely with Polio New Zealand to ensure that their members would continue to receive relevant support and services.
- West Auckland Parkinson's Project: Supported by the Bollard Trust, we provided assessments and interventions for individuals with recently diagnosed Parkinson's, identifying gaps in service availability.
- Polio New Zealand: We worked closely with their board during wind-up of their charity to ensure support and services for their members continue to be available through the Duncan Foundation.

Clinical Team Growth

- Expanded our team to 34 affiliated clinicians across 13 clinics, adding five new clinics and 15 clinicians, over the last year to ensure national service accessibility.
- Supported our clinical team with peer supervision, condition-specific meetings, and opportunities to attend condition-specific professional development.

Complementary Activities

- Held a six-week Polio Fatigue Management course attended by 6 individuals
- Delivered presentations to the Whakatane Polio support group and Parkinson's New Zealand Online Support Group Greater Auckland Area.
- Participated in research, such as the pilot trial on the effect of Transcranial Direct Current Stimulation on ataxia in SCA1
 patients.
- Participated in the Centre for Brain Research Steering Group to improve Parkinson's health outcomes, especially for Māori and Pacific communities.
- Supported Pacifica Parkinson's meetings for PINK1 individuals.

Statement of Accounting Policies

Duncan Foundation For the year ended 31 March 2024

Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Duncan Foundation is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.
