Statement of Service Performance

Duncan Foundation For the year ended 31 March 2022

Description of Entity's Outcomes

The Duncan Foundation's services are aimed at improving the physical and mental well-being of New Zealanders living with neurological conditions currently these include late effects of polio (LEoP); idiopathic focal dystonia; recently diagnosed Parkinson's (RDP); Friedreich's ataxia (FA), spinocerebellar ataxia (SCA) and other inherited ataxias. We will continue to expand the conditions we support as needs are identified.

Patients with progressive neurological conditions live with disabilities varying from chronic to acute, including impairment in muscle function (sensory, coordination and power), fatiguability and pain. They experience lower quality of life levels than people from the general population. After diagnosis, unless they have an acute event, (e.g., a fall), there is no defined treatment pathway offered to them. With intervention, there is the potential to slow this decline rate, sustain quality of life for longer, and reduce or delay the risk of acute events.

Improving awareness of condition-specific management and access to appropriate services in a timely manner and without a financial barrier for our patients is a crucial driver of our work.

The Duncan Foundation network of clinicians provides people living with neurological conditions with clinical assessment, treatment and onward referral where appropriate. Working together to develop self-management tools to improve quality of life and symptom management.

The Duncan Foundation supports our network of clinicians through resource sharing, peer reviews, journal reviews and feedback from continuing professional development learning.

Another key goal is to advance knowledge of these conditions to the broader health and community sector through delivery of educational presentations, participation in research and working with patient groups to understand current needs, available services and develop treatment protocols and outcomes. Examples of these activities during the period ended 31 March 2022 include.

- National Clinical Study Days held in May 2021
- Presentations to community groups, including Dystonia Patient Network, Parkinson's New Zealand, Muscular Dystrophy Association and FARA New Zealand.
- Presentations to health professionals, including Occupational Therapy Neurological Special Interest group and Auckland Neurologists meeting.

Through a concerted outreach effort since our establishment, the Duncan Foundation has increased the number of patient referrals from neurologists, allied health professionals, general practitioners and community support groups. In response to the increased service provision needs, on 31 March 2022, we were working with 22 Duncan Foundation endorsed clinicians in nine regions throughout New Zealand.

COVID-19

Due to the ongoing impact of Covid-19 and the vulnerability of many of our patient group the Duncan Foundation's clinical team responded to the lockdowns and patient concerns by ensuring flexibility of our service provision through the adoption of online meeting technology.

Where needed we use online platforms for group and individual teaching, exercise classes and consultations to ensure accessibility for our patient base.

In collaboration with Polio New Zealand we held 62 online Polio morning & afternoon tea sessions with 957 attendances over the year.

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Centre for Brain Research - Neurogenetics Research Clinic

Generous funding support from the Lindsay Foundation enabled the Duncan Foundation to continue to work with the Centre for Brain Research - Neurogenetics Research Clinic (NGRC) through the fiscal year ended 31 March 2022.

The focus of our input into this research is to provide therapists (e.g., neuro-physiotherapists, occupational therapists and speech and language therapists) experienced in working with neurogenetic conditions to provide patients assessments. The clinic aims to assist in the development and trialling of future interventional treatment strategies for patients with neurogenetic conditions in New Zealand.

To alleviate clinic delays caused by Covid-19 we increased our one-to-one patient assessments for this patient group to ensure they had access to relevant therapist assessments and treatment. Under our NGRC pathway, we work with people living with neurogenetic conditions including Friedreich's ataxia, spinocerebellar ataxia and other inherited ataxias.

'How did we do our accounting?'

Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Duncan Foundation is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash
